CATG meeting - Councillor Simon Wager reported to Council the proposal for Maiden Bradley actioned by Martin Rose the Principal Traffic Engineer for Traffic & Network Management at Wiltshire Council Highways & Transport, following their site meetings. It had been approved by the Community Action Traffic Group meeting (CATG).

Martin Rose the Principal Traffic Engineer had proposed work to the traffic calming and costed the full proposal as shown on a drawing to be £5,400.00 (the PC's contribution for this project @ 25% would be £1,350.00)

A significant proportion of the cost is the high friction surfacing (HFS) on the southern approach to the 1st traffic island.

If the High friction surface was omitted the overall cost reduced to £3,200.00 (the PC's contribution @ 25% would be £800.00)

Following full discussions on the two proposals, re possible noise issues with high friction surfaces, the wishes of the Community in the vicinity regarding traffic issues, along with the Clerks briefing on the impact on next year's budget as these works would have a large impact as they had not been budgeted for.

Council resolved the full proposal at the higher cost of a 25% contribution of £1350.00. The Clerk was instructed that this would be met from the Risk & Contingences budget. A map of the proposed work will be place on the Bus Stop noticeboard and uploaded to the website.

Community Speed Watch Volunteers - There was a report back from the Clerk on her meeting on the 12th February 2019 with Rodger Fooks Community Speed Watch Co-Ordinator Crime Prevention Department Wiltshire Police. The Clerk provided Councillor Simon Wager with the new forms given to her to be completed by parishioners. These would need to be returned as soon as possible so that the Clerk could send them to Rodger Fooks to process the Background checks required before Parishioners could take part in Speed Watch. Council noted that there could be up to 14 weeks before the system would be up and running. Rodger Fooks would inform the Clerk which Communities Maiden Bradley would share the Speed Watch unit with and arrange a date for training to take place with parishioners. It was also noted that the Rural Policing Team would also join the Community Speed Watch Team on occasions to back up the work of the group.

Litter Pick –The Community Litter pick will be held on the **23rd March 2019** and start at the Community Allotment Garden **at 10.00am**. Councillor Simon Wager will be present to hand out equipment and note areas parishioners would like to clear.

Do contact Councillor Simon Wager if you would be interesting in borrowing some equipment and actioning adhoc litter picking to help enhance the appearance of the parish. All are welcome to attend. Refreshments will be provided after the litter pick at the Somerset Arms from all those who take part. The Parish Council wish to give a huge thank you to the Somerset Arms for this kind offer.

Date of the next meeting- The Council agreed that **Tuesday 12th March 2019** would be the date of the next Parish Council meeting.

As always, the Parish Council meeting will be open at the start with an opportunity for members of the public to ask questions or make comments on any matter. All Saints' - Renewal of Electoral Roll 2019 - Deadline 9th March

The Electoral Roll is your parish church's register of electors. In the same way that being on the civic Electoral Roll allows you to vote in parliamentary, local elections and referenda, joining the Church Electoral Roll means that you can vote on Church matters, attend the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) raise any question of parochial or general church interest and stand for election to the PCC. The APCM this year is on Sunday 24th March.

Being on the Electoral Roll does NOT make you a "member" of the Church; simply regarding All Saints as your spiritual home does that. Indeed, a condition of joining the Roll is that you are already a "member" of a Church.

The Roll is completely renewed every six years, at which point all members have to re-apply for membership or else their names will be deleted. By this means, the continuing validity of the Roll is maintained. The Roll is being renewed in 2019, so you need to apply or re-apply to have your name on the Roll.

Joining the Electoral Roll is an important way of confirming your commitment to All Saints' community and to the vision of the church. But, it also opens up the way for greater involvement in the life and government of the church.

You can of course be a full and active member of All Saints Church without joining the Roll. Being on the Electoral Roll does not entail signing up to any additional commitments, but numbers are important in the present climate in which the Church of England needs to be aware of the commitment of its people. Church morale is affected by statistics and, while it would be wrong to inflate the significance of the Roll, it would be a missed opportunity to ignore it.

Joining the Roll is an important statement of witness and a step along the path of discipleship. With your name on the Electoral Roll, the strength of the Church can be seen in our local area, and across the Diocese. If you think of All Saints as YOUR church, you should be on the Electoral Roll!

Application forms will be sent to all current members in February and are also available in the porch of the Church and the Village Memorial Hall. They should be returned to the Church, the Hall or to the Electoral Roll Officer (Victoria de Maré, Old Dower House, Maiden Bradley, Warminster, Wiltshire, BA12 7HW - white post box) before 9th March.
