MY FAMILY INTEREST IN THE VILLAGE OF THE PAST

For many years I have been reading the Maiden Bradley Village Magazine, first by post and now on-line, as one branch of my family named Snook lived in the village in days gone by. It was a pity I could not attend your recent History Festival held at the end of July, but as I live in West Sussex that wasn't possible.

I would be interested to know if anyone living in Maiden Bradley today have ancestors going back to James Snook, who was baptised in 1808 and married first Charlotte (nee Newbury) and then Emma (nee White). James Snook Snr had a son James who was born in 1848 in the village and 'married' my Great Great Grandmother Eliza (nee Moon). Their marriage has never been found but they went on to have a large family including my great grandfather Charles who was born to Eliza before she married James.

It seems to be a complicated family with different stories attached to them. James Snook Jnr died in 1901 in Frome Workhouse, but I have never found Eliza's death or burial. According to the 1901 census James was a widower, but an elderly relative, now deceased herself, once said she visited Eliza Snook, when she was a teenager, in the village, but that would have been in the early $20^{\rm th}$ century, certainly after 1901.

Does anyone have the mysterious Eliza in their family? I have taken my Snook family back to the earliest known record that being Philip Snook who was born c1762 and died in 1841. If anyone would like to shed any information on the above my e-mail address is: Valerie.dare@ntlworld.com


